



Langston University is located at Langston, Oklahoma, eleven miles east of Guthrie and one and one half miles west of Coyle on State Highway 33. The College is situated on a beautiful hill overlooking a vast expanse of open prairie.

The institution was established by Act of Territorial Council and House, March 12, 1897. Its doors were opened to students in the fall of 1898.


#### CAREER OPPORTUNITIES



- 10. To serve as an educational center and community agency contributing to the betterment of the cultural, vocational and educational standards throughout the state



In a recent Oklahoma Collegiate Conference game, Langston quarterback Donald Lee Smith was hurled to the ground by a rival tackler.

"I thought you were the guy who's supposed to be so good," cracked the tackler.

"Well," smiled Smith as he hauled himself to his feet, "at least you know who I am and I never heard of you!"

And that's true. Rarely if ever, has a small-college football player made such a name for himself in Oklahoma.

In 1957 the Lions didn't win a single football game and although Langston was to become a member of the Oklahoma Collegiate Conference the next season, other member schools didn't feel much real competition had been added.

But before the 1958 campaign arrived, coach Tim Crisp was hired to return Langton's football program to lofty heights. With him came Donald Lee Smith, whose passing had paced Crisp's Ardmore Douglass team to the state Class B high school championship.

The result has been amazing. As a freshman Smith ranked fourth nationally with 1,132 passing yards as the Lions won four and lost three before losing in the Prairie View Bowl.

Smith completed nearly 53 percent of his aerials that year on 76 of 144. And before the next season began, Crisp went on record as saying, "I hope Donald Lee can do better this year."

That was a tall order, but then Smith is able to fill such requests. As a Sophomore in the '59 season, he threw for 1,438 yards and completed better than 62 percent of his throws. He tossed for 15 touchdowns and Langston smashed through all conference rivals with ease and finished with a 7-1 record.













## DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION


#### Professor A. C. Shropshire, Director

(4) To acquaint the young homemaker with some of the managerial skills and techniques necessary to meet the needs of persons living in a modern and changing world. (5) To educate youth for the dual responsibility of earning a livelihood and of living an effective life. (6) To stress the value of acquiring high moral standards and ideals.

The curriculum leads to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Home Economics. Vocational and/or general teaching certificates may be obtained on the completion of the degree program.



# DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRIAL EDUCATION








# DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL SCIENCES

#### Ada Lois Fisher, Instructor-Acting Chairman


The Social Science Department includes the subject fields of History, Sociology, political science, philosophy, geography and economics. A major may be obtained in History or sociology.
