Evidence gathered by ISE after a three-year (1967-70) experiment in the Thirteen College Curriculum Program for traditional black institutions of higher learning suggests that alternative approaches to traditional learning situations are valid and warranted. As a result of its findings and to prove the hypothesis, the Institute for Services to Education (ISE) has extended the program to an additional Five College Consortium of which Langston University is a member. The FCCIT Program at Langston has as a desired goal excellence in education. Students who enroll in this program are expected to achieve high academic goals but are encouraged and motivated to use innovative approaches. Techniques may change, but the desired goal of producing qualified competent individuals will continue to be the aim of the university.

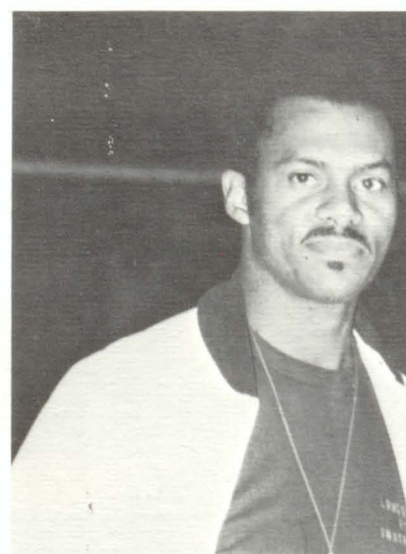
LIONS COACHING STAFF



ALBERT SCHOATS begins his second year as head coach after six successful seasons in the high school ranks. A former All-American halfback at Langston, Coach Schoats returns to his Alma Mater from Muskogee Manual where he coached football for four seasons. He received the Coach of the Year Award at Muskogee in 1964, and was named Coach of the Year in the Eastern State Conference in 1966.
