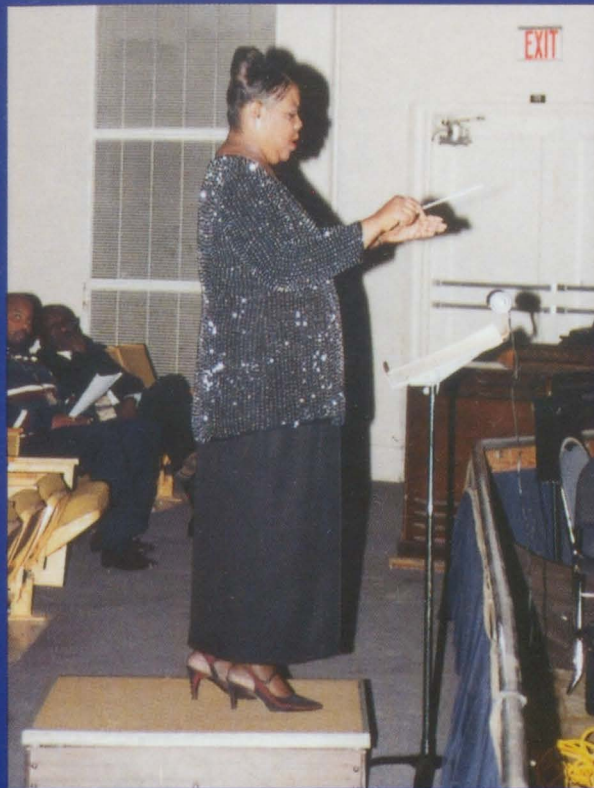

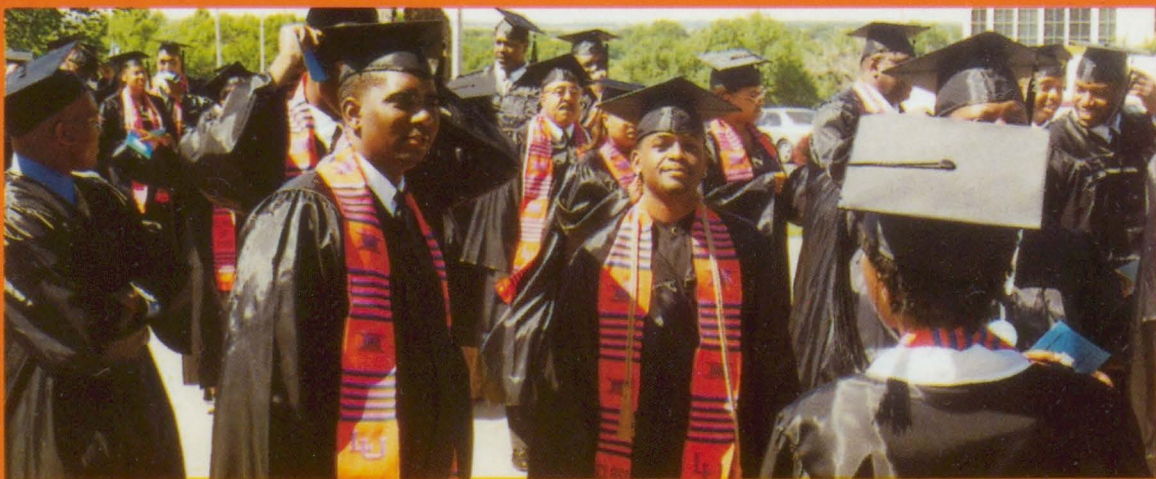

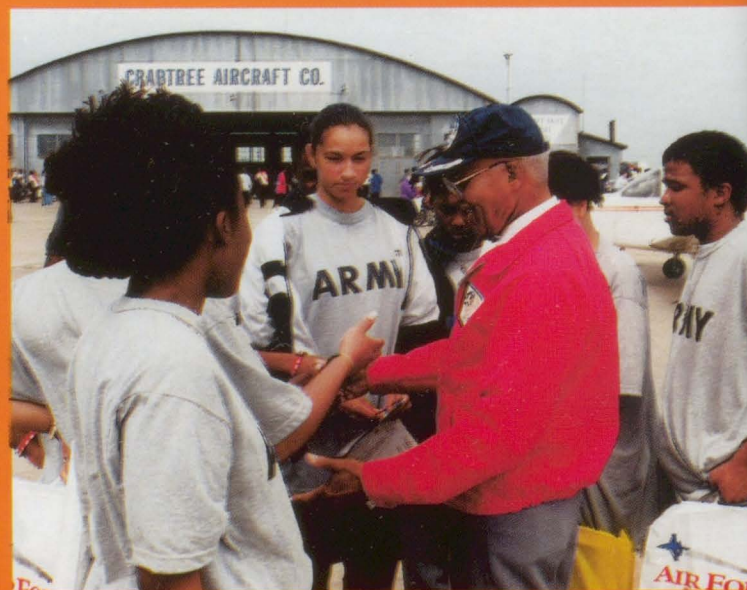

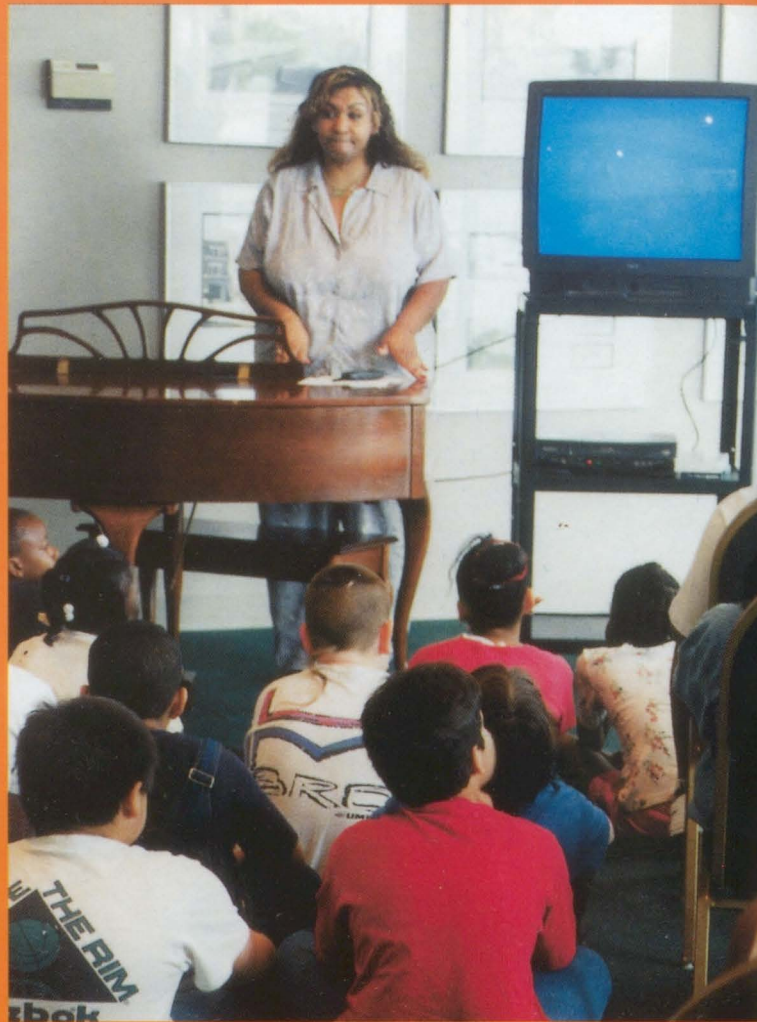


First Annual Fourth Grade Day

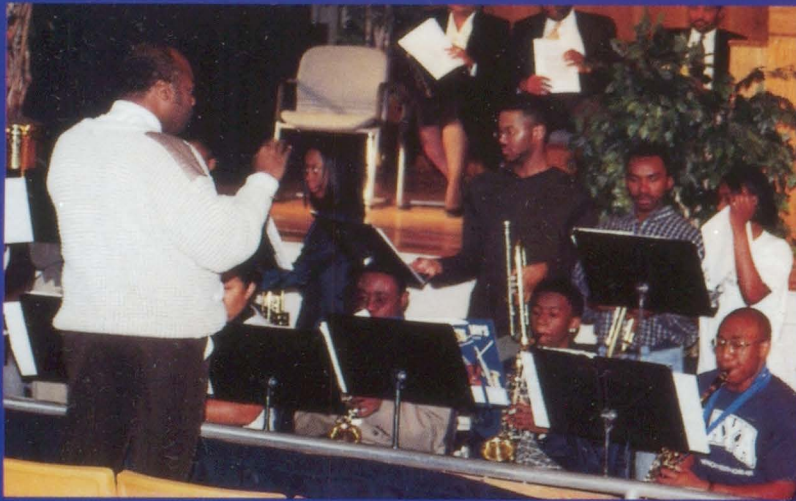


Tenth Ira D. Hall Lecture Series

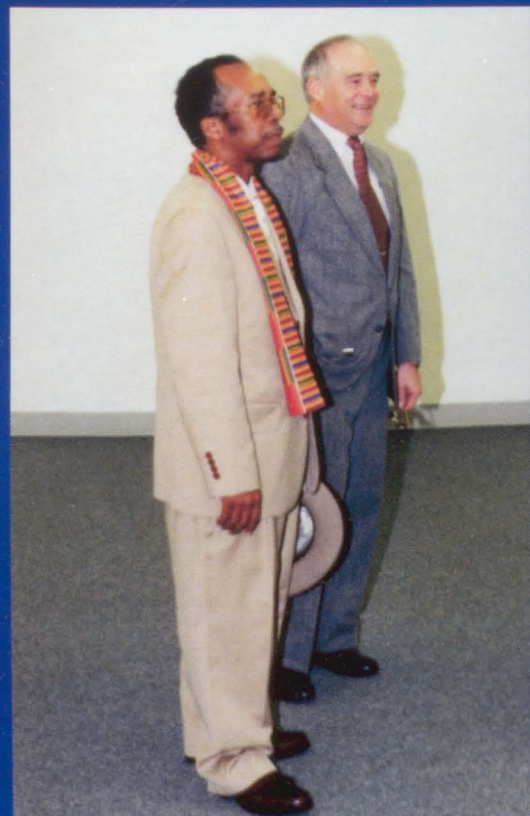

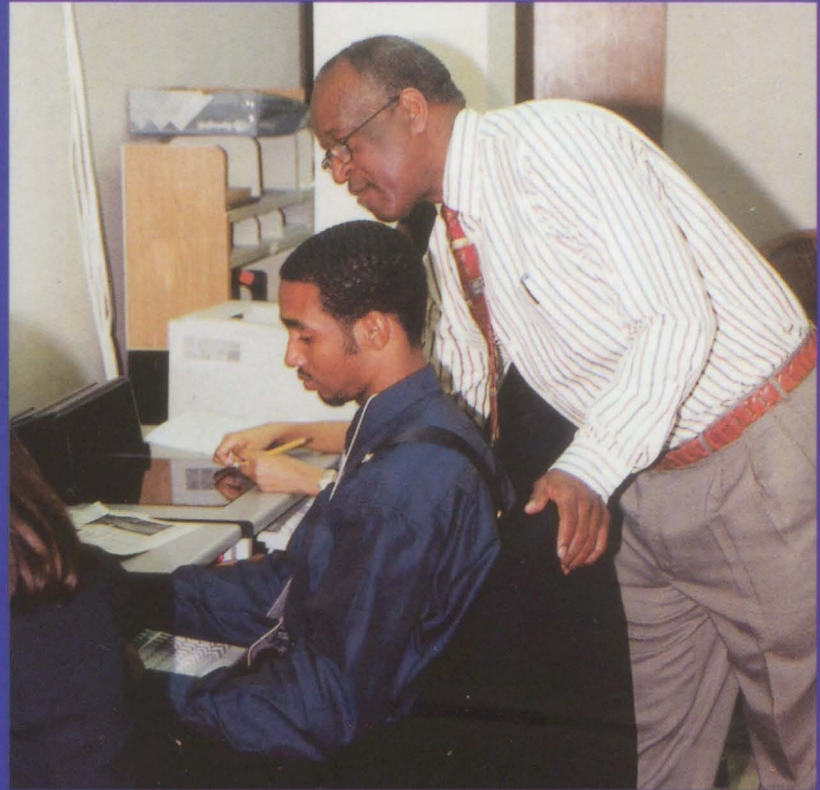

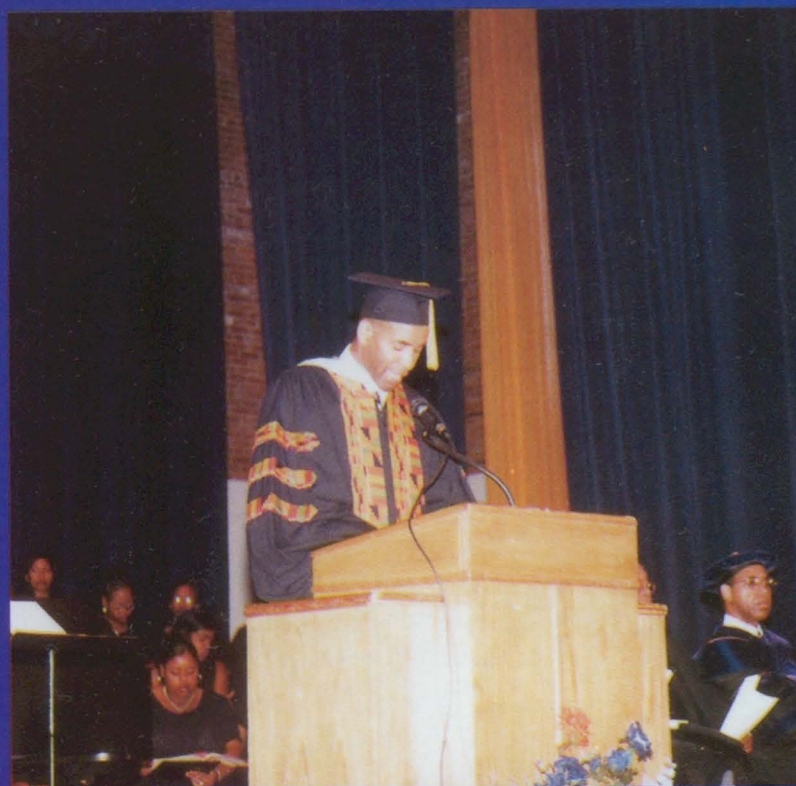

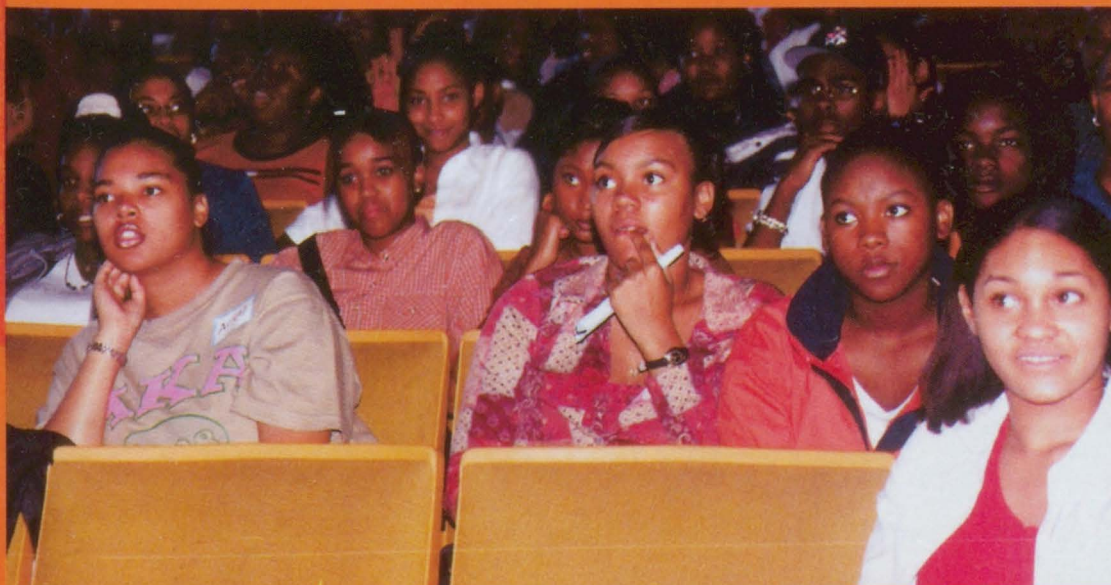

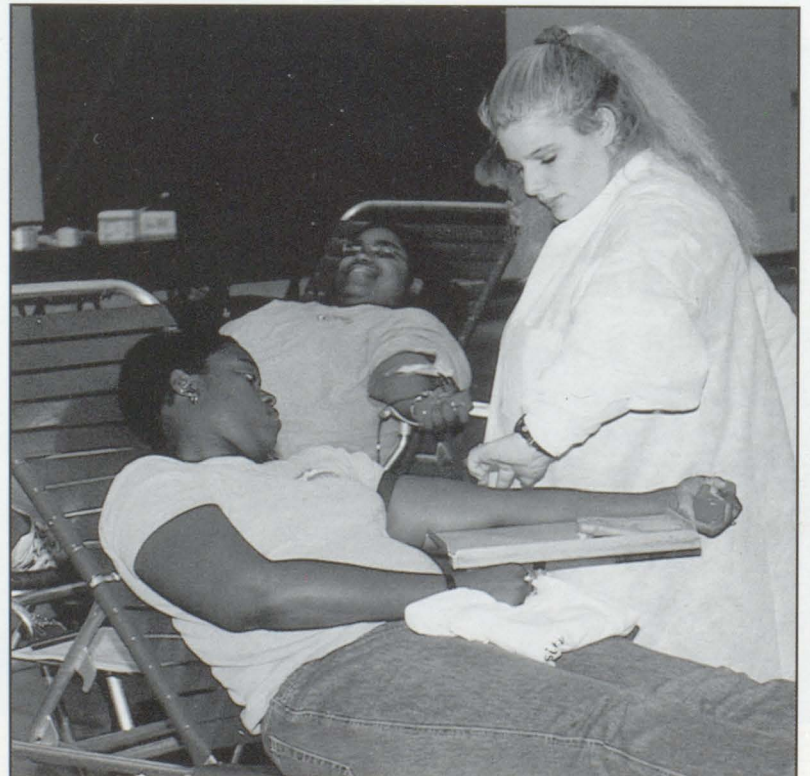
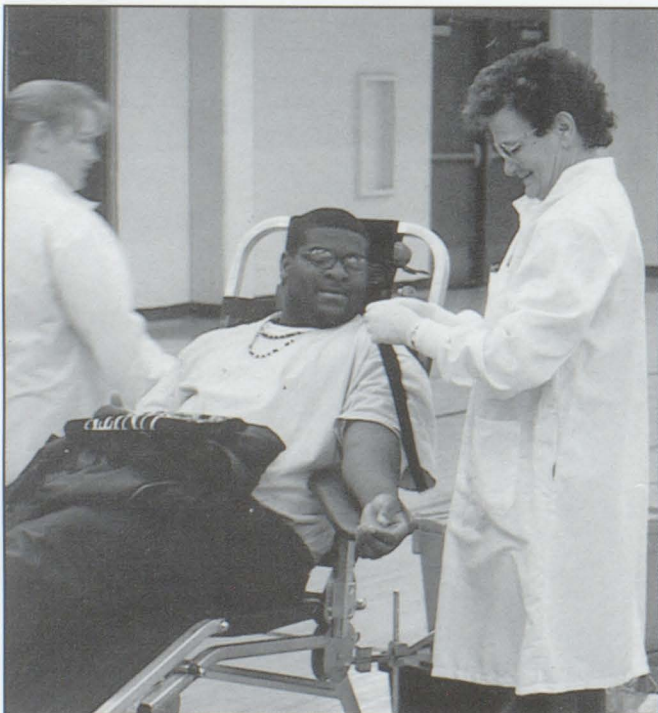
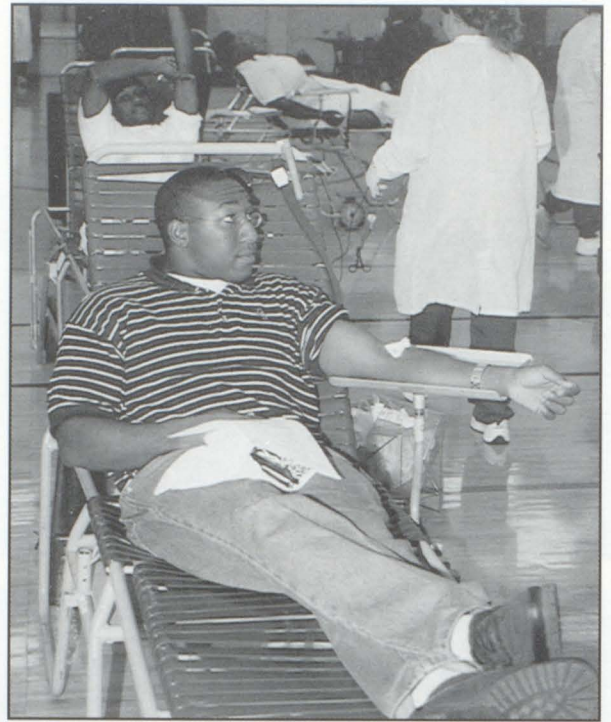
Technology Department Receives FAA Accreditation

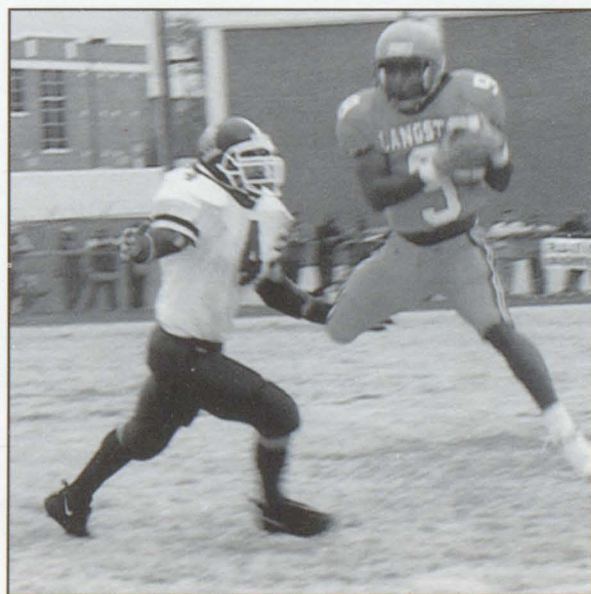

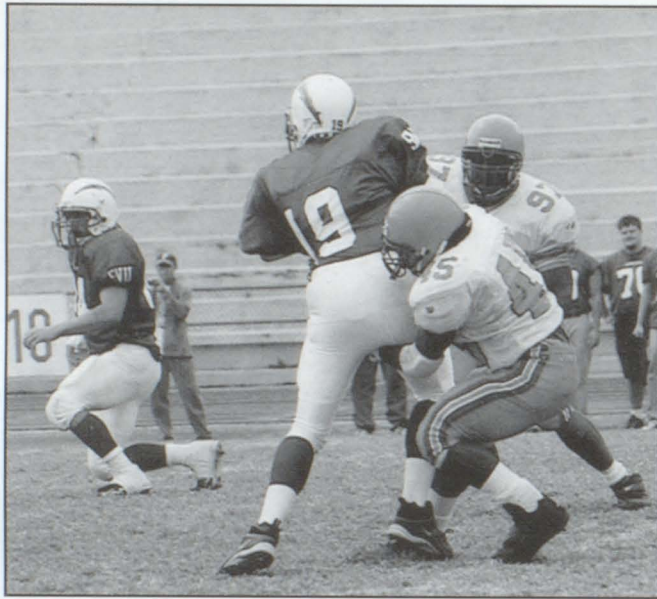

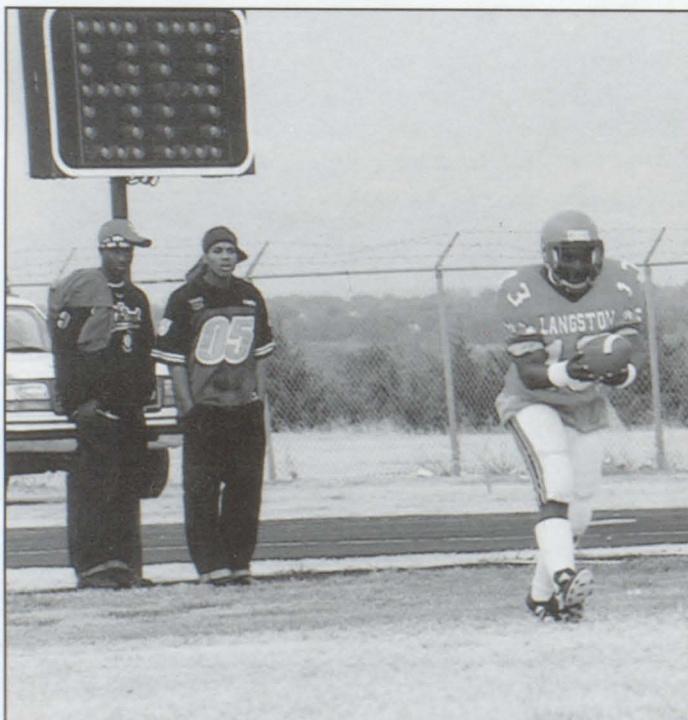

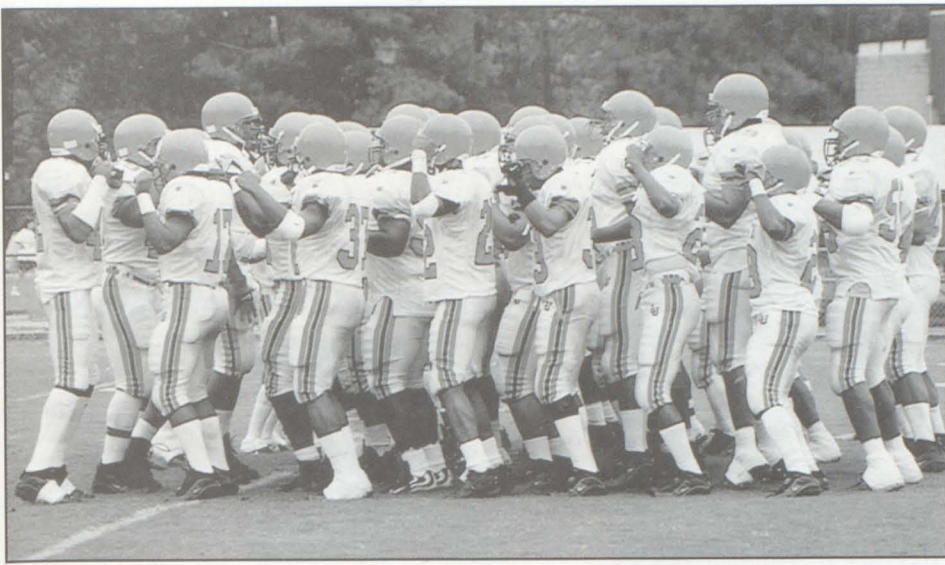

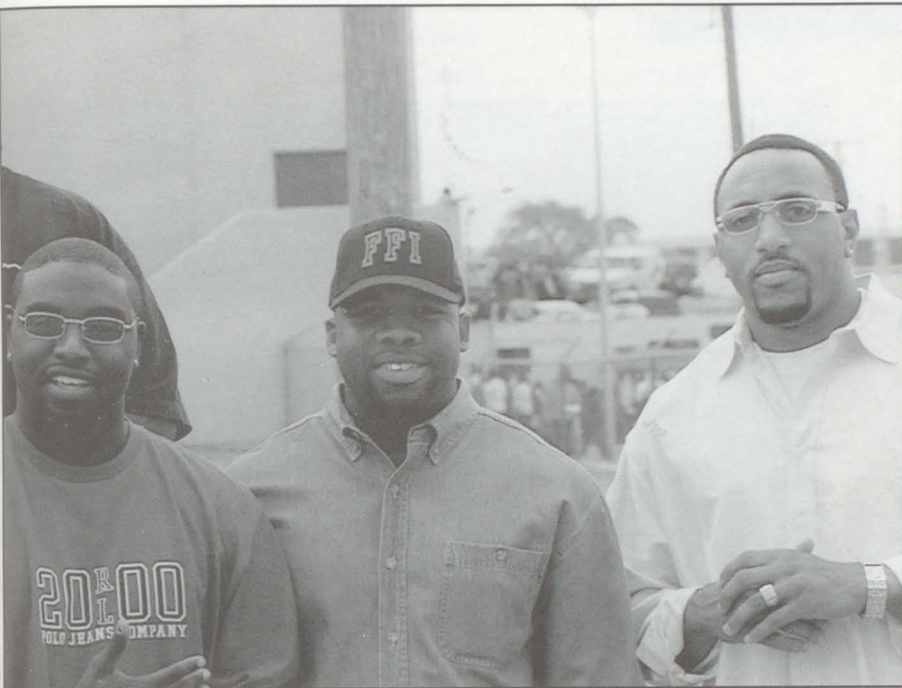

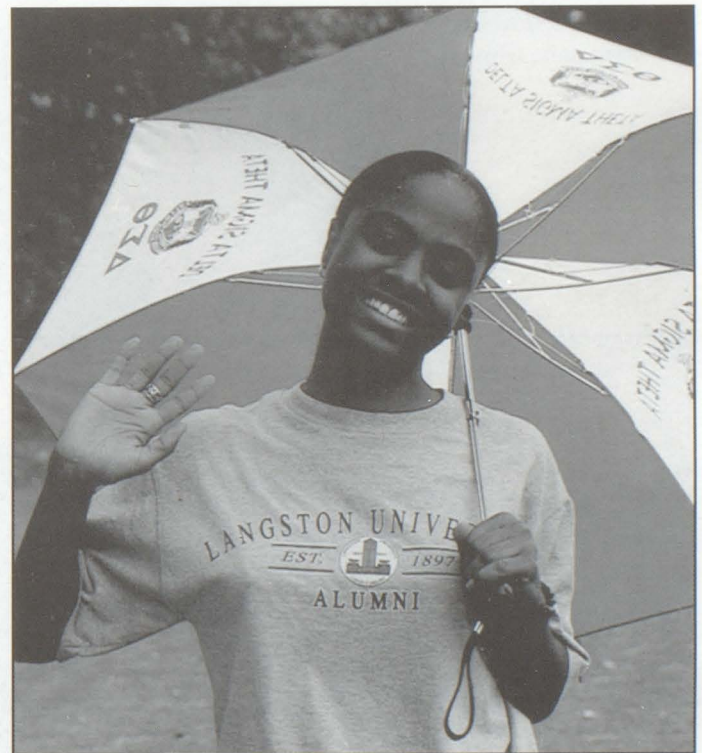

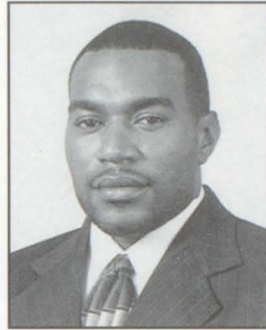

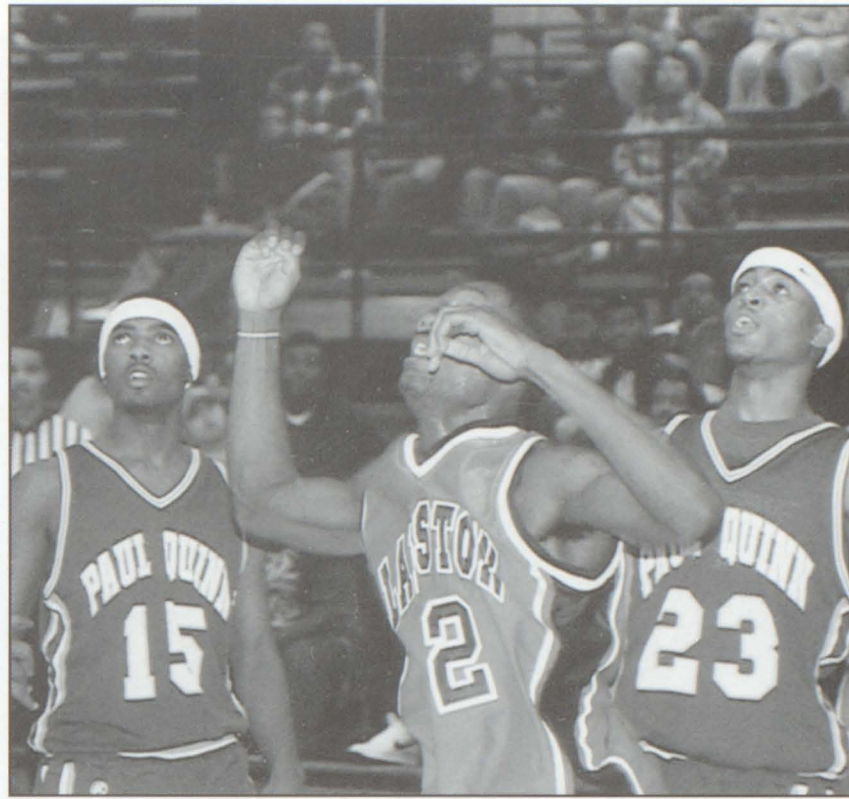

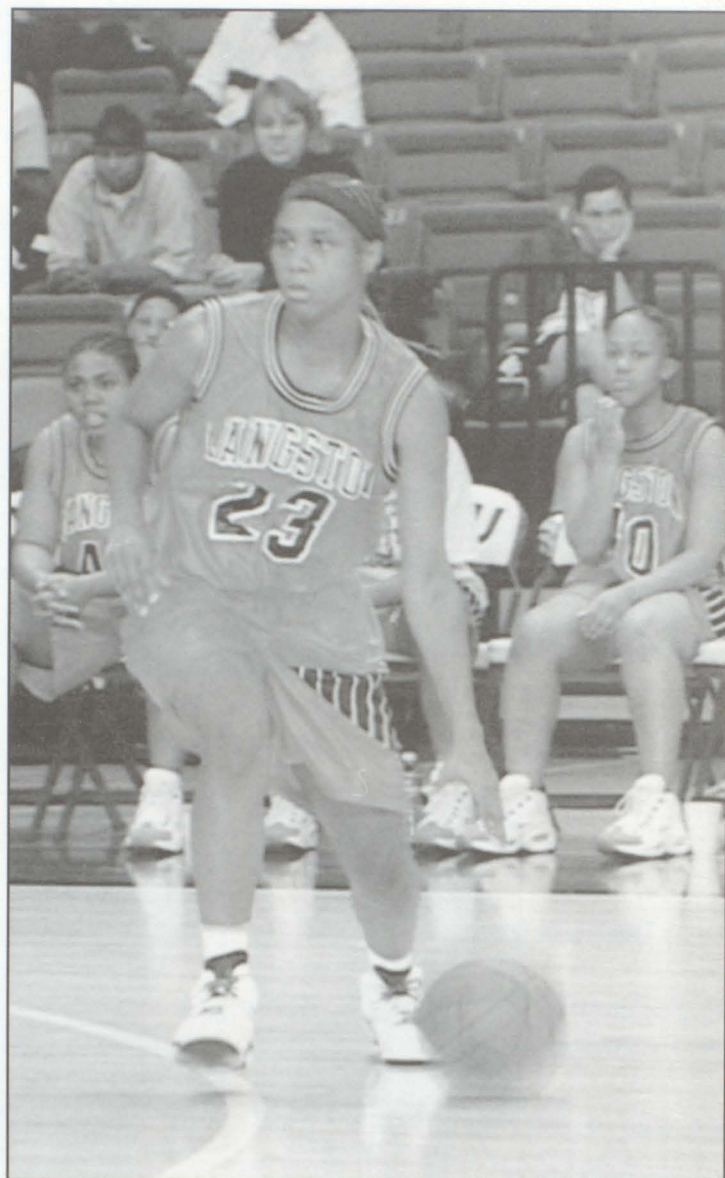

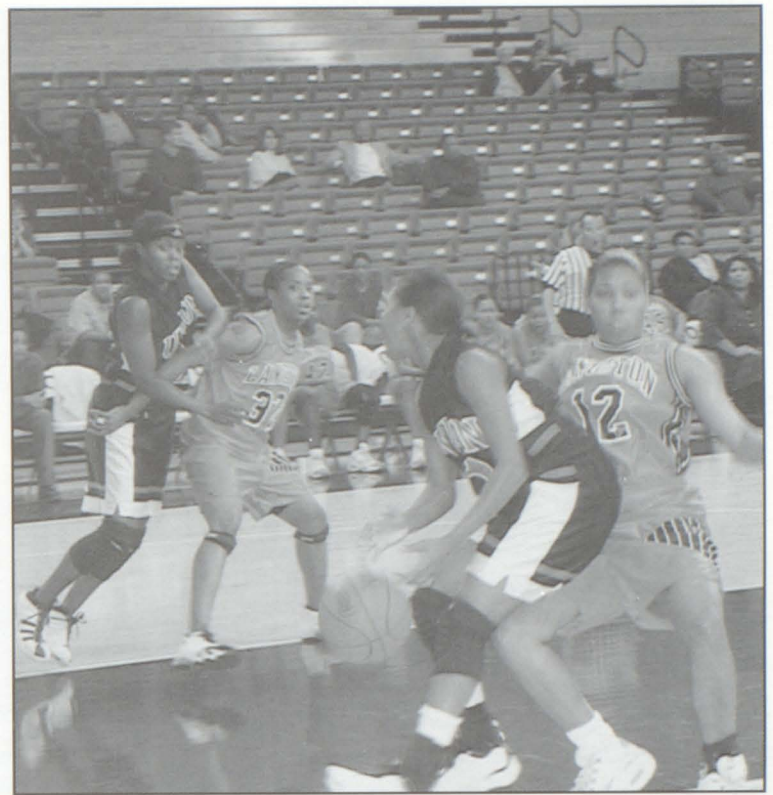

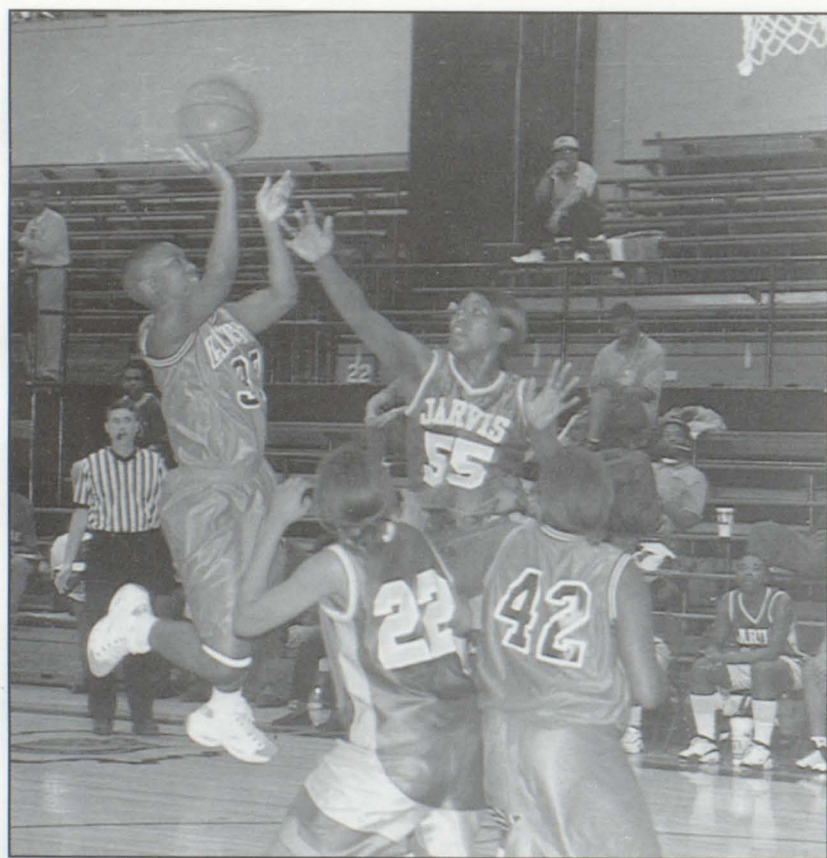

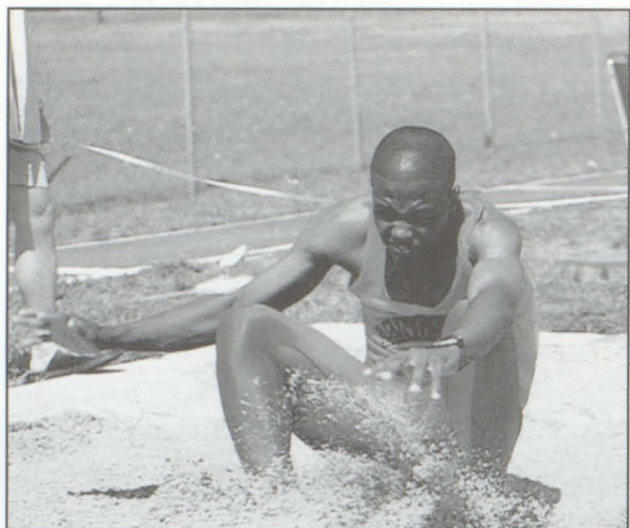

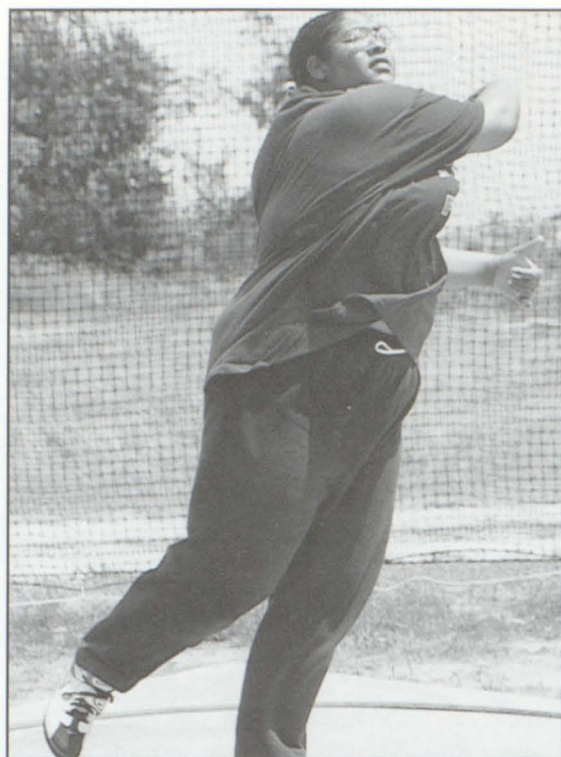

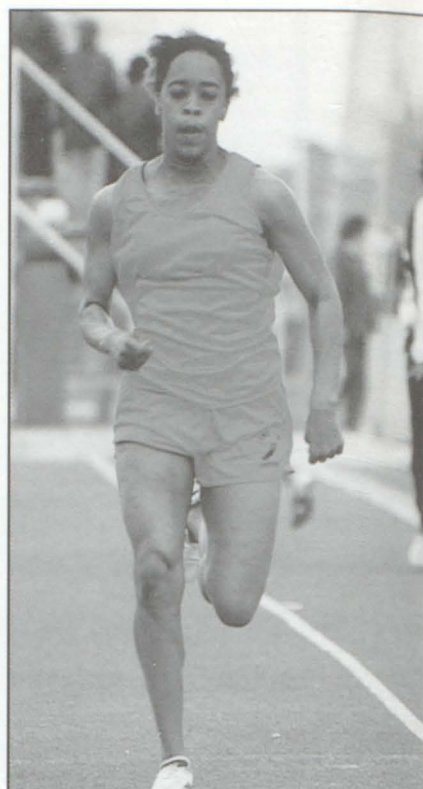

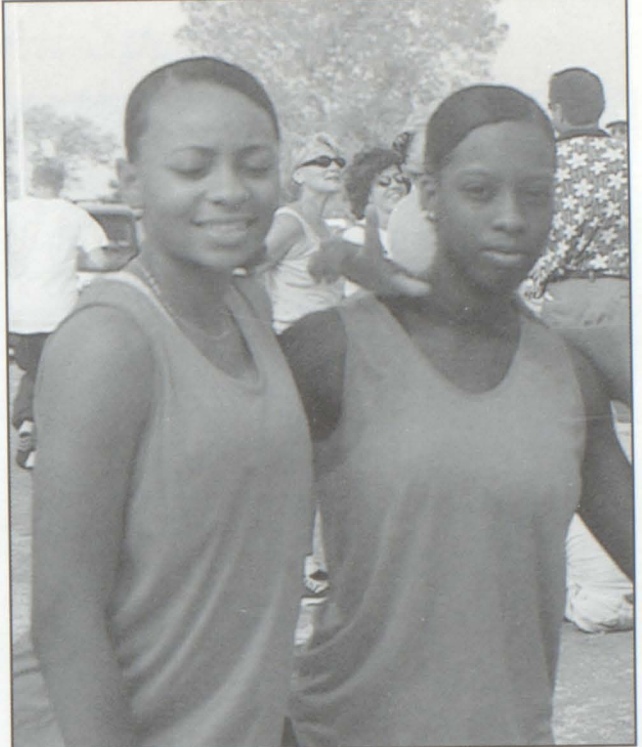

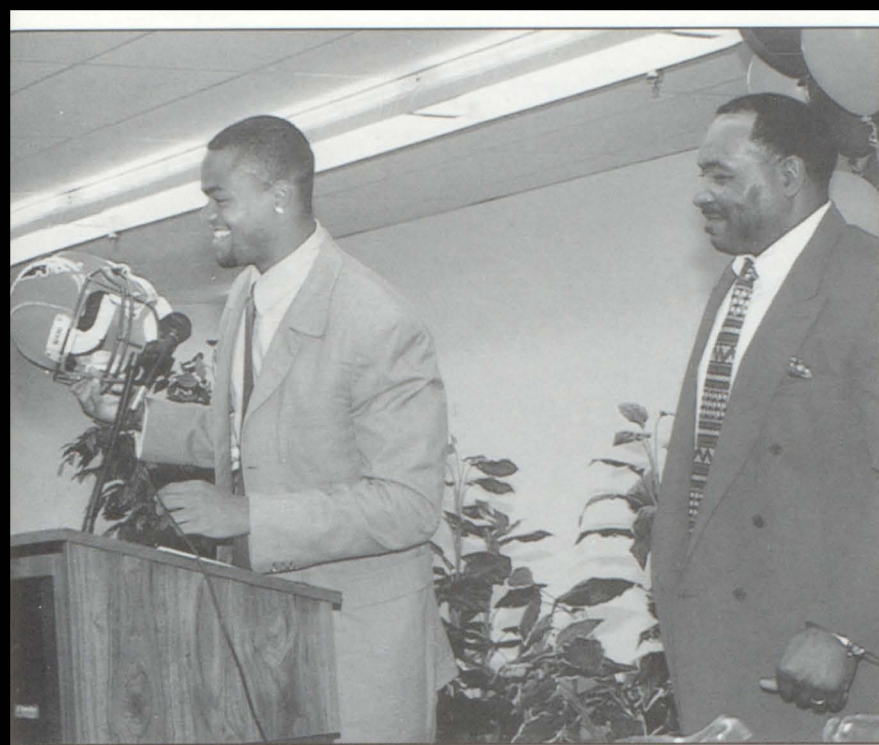

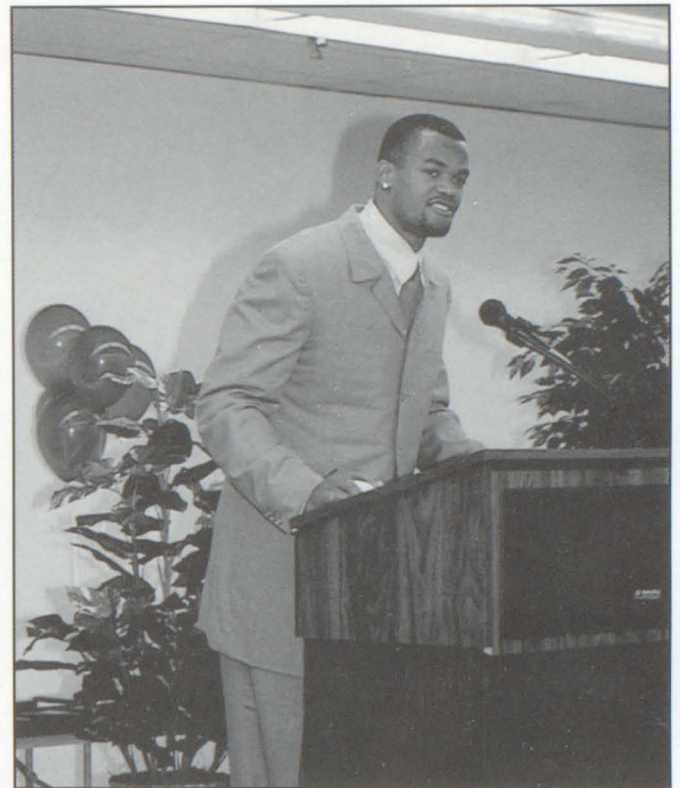
