Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. Beta Kappa Chapter-Founded March 12, 1932



Alpha Phi Alpha, the first intercollegiate Greek-letter fraternity, established for African-Americans, was founded at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York on December 4, 1906 by seven college men who recognized the need for a strong bond of Brotherhood among African descendants in this country. The visionary founders, known as the "Jewels" of the Fraternity, are Henry Arthur Callis, Charles Henry Chapman, Eugene Kinckle Jones, George Biddle Kelley, Nathaniel Allison Murray, Robert Harold Ogle, and Vertner Woodson Tandy. The Jewels set outstanding examples of scholarship, leadership and successpreceding the efforts even of the NAACP and similar civil rights organizations. The fraternity boasts a total membership of over 150,000, being the largest of all African-American Greek Fraternities. The fraternity promotes community service, and since 1977 has been conducting a million-dollar fundraising drive to benefit the National Urban League, the NAACP and the United Negro College Fund.



Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc



Kappa Alpha Psi was founded on the campus of Indiana University on January 5, 1911. The Fraternity's fundamental purpose is achievement.

Early in this century, African-American students were actively dissuaded from attending college. Formidable obstacles were erected to prevent the few who were enrolled from assimilating into co-curricular campus life. This ostracism characterized Indiana University in 1911, thus causing Elder W. Diggs, Byron K. Armstrong, and eight other black students to form Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, which remains the only Greek letter organization with its 1st Chapter on the University's campus.

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.



On Friday evening, November 17, 1911, three Howard University undergraduate students, with the assistance of their faculty advisor, gave birth to the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. This event occured in the office of biology Professor Ernest E. Just, the faculty advisor, in the Science Hall (now known as Thirkield Hall). Three liberal arts students were Edgar A. Love, Oscar J. Cooper and Frank Coleman. From the initials of the Greek phrase meaning "friendship is essential to the soul," the name Omega Psi Phi was derived. The phrase was selected as the motto. Manhood. scholarship, perseverance and uplift were adopted as cardinal principles. A decision was made regarding the design for the pin and emblem, and thus ended the first meeting of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

n January 9, 1914, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. was founded on the campus of Howard University in Washington, D.C., dedicated to the principles of Brotherhood, Scholarship and Service, which are crystallized in the motto: "Culture for Service and Service for Humanity." Today, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. boast over 165,000 members worldwide, and the founding principles are manifested through its three national programs, Education, Social

Action and Bigger and Better Business. Beta Epsilon Chapter at Langston University was the last of the eight Pan-Hellenic organizations to be established on campus. The Beta Epsilon Chapter was officially chartered on May 6, 1947. Since that time it has become a vital force at Langston, and has been named "Outstanding Fraternity" for the 1999-2000 and 2000-2001 school years, and the "Organization-of-the-Year" for 2000-2001 school year.

Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. was founded in 1922 at Butler University in Indianapolis and has a total membership of 38,000. Committed to community service, the sorority operated the Vocational Guidance Workshop Center in New York which focuses on job training. 


















