ITEMS OF INTEREST . . .

President Hale has announced that effective March 15, Dr. J.W. Sanford, Jr. of Oklahoma City, will serve as University Physician and Director of the Health Program. Dr. Sanford received his undergraduate training and his M.D. degree from Howard University. He is a practicing physician in Oklahoma City. He is the son of the eighth President of Langston University, the late Dr. J.W. Sanford, Sr. who served from 1935-1939 and for whom Sanford Hall was named.

"We are pleased to have Dr. Sanford join us," said President Hale. "He will not only help build an excellent health program for the University community but will be a source of great inspiration to our students."

MR. JAMES E. GLOVER, senior mathematics student, has been placed on the Honorable Mention List of the Danforth Foundation as a result of his application for a Danforth Graduate Fellowship and a special interview. We congratulate Mr. Glover although he did not receive a Danforth Fellowship. Of the 122 Fellowships granted, only three were granted to students from predominantly Negro Institutions: Tougaloo College, Bishop College and Morehouse College. Only eight students from Predominantly Negro Institutions were listed on the Honorable Mention List of more than 250 students.
