ACT Test will be administered on October 21, 1972. All students who have not had the ACT Test or College Entrance Examination are urged to take the test. The Fee is \$7.50.

The National Teachers Examination will be administered on November 11, 1972. The Last Registration date is October 19, 1972. The students may register in Room A-15, Sanford Hall Annex. The fee is \$16.00

The Graduate Record Examination is scheduled for December 9, 1972. November 14, 1972 is the last date for registration. All seniors are urged to take the test. There is no fee. Students may register in Room A-15, Sanford Hall Annex.

A Navy Information Team will be on campus Oct. 18 through 19 to explain officer programs available for freshmen through graduate students. The team will be located in the Student Union.

The team will explain the programs available which will enable a student to graduate from college before reporting for active duty and will also administer qualification tests without obligation.

Physical qualifications vary for different programs. Anyone who is in doubt about meeting these qualifications should drop by and the team will be happy to discuss the situation.

All programs lead to a commission as a Naval Officer and several programs are open to women as well as men.
