Proceeds from Play to be Given to Freedom Center. At 8:30 p.m., Mondays, November 11, 18, and 25, 1968, the Mummings Theatre in Oklahoma City will present Martin Duberman's "In White America". Benefits from the play will be given to the NAACP Youth Council's Freedom Center, burned out last fall by an arsonist. The play includes freedom songs, scenes from a slave and master in pre-Civil War relations, violence and pathos.
