FIVE MEMBERS OF LU LIONS FOOTBALL TEAM SELECTED AS ALL-CONFERENCE PLAYERS

Congratulations to Kenneth Payne, Alphonso Post, Don McDade, Prinson Poindexter, and Ananias Carson for receiving 1972 All-Conference honors.

KENNETH PAYNE, a 6'3, 185 lbs. junior from Choctaw, Oklahoma, is a first team choice as split end on the All-Conference team. Payne is also a Langston University Football All-American Candidate.

ALPHONSO POST, 6'2, 190 lbs. senior from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, is first team choice for kicker. Post has 54 punts for 1808 yards and an average of 32.4 yards.

DON McDADE, 6'4, 240 lbs. junior from Okmulgee, Oklahoma, is All-Conference first team choice for tackle.

PRINSON POINDEXTER, 6'1, 170 lbs. junior from Memphis, Tennessee, is second team choice fro All-Conference quarterback. Poindexter has completed 177 passes out of 324 attempts for 2096 yards and 17 touchdowns.

ANANIAS CARSON, 6'1 170 lbs. junior, has been selected for the second year as an All-Conference player. Carson, who hails from Tulsa, Oklahoma, received honors for second team All-Conference end.
