SGA ELECTIONS

Once again it is time for Student Government Association Officers' election. These are jobs that require a lot of time, dedication, and devotion to the job. Consider this before running for an office. The qualifications are as follows:

President - must be a senior at the time of tenure and have no fewer than 75 semester hours at the time he runs. He must have a 2.5 average or better with at least 50 hours completed at Langston University.

Vice-president: Must have completed 45 semester hours at time of running with a grade point average of 2.5 or better and must complete 60 hours before tenure.

Secretary: Must have completed 30 semester hours before running with a 2.5 grade average or better.

Treasurer: Must have completed 30 semester hours before running with a 2.5 grade average or better.

Activities Director : Must have completed 30 semester hours before running with a 2.5 grade average or better.

Applications for each office may be obtained in the S. G. A. office or Office of Student Affairs. The deadline for applications is April 5. The elections will be held April 12.
