Students who do not have on file at the Health Center a complete physical examination report will be required to do so before they are permitted to enroll this 1972 Spring Semester. Students who may not be able to see their family physician may contact the University Physician for an appointment with him to give the physical in his office. On November 29, 1971, an LU group composed of student leaders and faculty were responsible for 224 Langstonites registering to vote in the Langston precinct. During previous elections there have been about 204 to actually vote in the Langston precinct. When the 18-year-olds are given the right to vote in state elections, the Langston community will have doubled its voting power. After the next voter registration drive, it is hoped that our voting power will have tripled. Next semester watch for the dates of the next registration drive.
